This Meeting is Private. Bearing false witness, misrepresentation and posting inflammatory rhetoric in public forums is forbidden and shall be addressed in an appropriate manner.

To eliminate all conflict and false allegations is there anyone in attendance at today's meeting that is a member or agent of any law enforcement agency or public agency at the federal, state, city, county or public agencies present?

"Anyone who is here under false pretenses, anyone who is working for any foreign government including the Territorial United States or Municipal United States, anyone who is being paid or coerced to be here, must fully disclose their presence and purpose now, or leave the premises"

If they subsequently show up as Federal Witness, they are discredited for failure to disclose. Is there a response to the Bevins decision for the First time? Second time? Third time?

Legal Education and Jurisdiction Insights - Mop n Bucket with Michelle Ford

- Anna educates attendees on the meaning of "code" in legal contexts, explaining that codes are constructive contracts, not laws, referencing the case *Self v. Rhay (Washington, 1963)*.
- She discusses the concept of unconscionable contracts imposed without consent, such as licenses or fees that convert natural rights into privileges, citing *Shuttlesworth v. Birmingham* (*Alabama*, 1962).
- Emphasis is placed on educating litigation committees to respond effectively to unlawful prosecutions under martial law claims by corporate entities.

- Events Committee (Plans and executes events, live meetings, and election set-up (see General Elections and Quorum Committee below for more about elections) *Chair- Alex, Secretary Kerry*
- Marshall at Arms Standing Committee of the Whole: The Marshal At-Arms is responsible for the protection of Assembly Members, Officers and Officials. They maintain order during The General Assembly meetings, The Marshal-At-Arms is responsible to keep track of The Assemblies assets. Assets may be Assembly records, website, passwords, money, silver, equipment, to name a few but not all inclusive.
- New Member Orientation Committee (Provides support and educational guidance for new members to overcome prior indoctrination and fear and dependency issues) *Chair Cynthia, Co-Chair Ryan. Classes are held on the 2nd and 4th*Tuesdays of every month- New ASN's will complete 3 classes that give a background on The Tennessee Assembly and The American States Assemblies being called into session and the provenance of reconstructing our republican form of govt. - Oversight Committee- Provides general oversight and a forum for complaints. Reviews complaints pertaining to the OPERATION of the committee and presents to the General Assembly.

- Vetting Committee (Approves membership and reviews candidate eligibility for elected positions, including background checks and "interviews" applicable to the positions being applied for.) Chair Vicky, Co-Chair Diane Please reach out to Alex

- Coroner's Office Committee Takes on the oversight functions for the Coroner's Office, investigates complaints and works with the coroner and the staff to improve their service and capabilities, recordkeeping, and end of life services.
- Court Venue Committee- Seeks accommodations for the Courts to hold Session. Negotiates use of our public buildings. Invokes Ex Parte Milligan, 2 U.S. 71
- Land Patent Committee -
- Law Education Committee in stasis (1. Evaluates educational opportunities to familiarize members of the Assembly about our Public Law and its administration past and present.
 - 2. Presents Common Law education opportunities.)
- **Jury Pool Committee** Develops pools of competent and eligible Jurors to serve on both Trial Juries and Grand Juries, administers selection of Jurors, reimbursement of expenses, and other issues related to maintaining and caring for Jurors.
- **Litigation Committee** Works with Tennessee Assembly members who have active litigation concerns to assist them with asserting their position with respect to the foreign courts and educating them to avoid entrapment.
- Sheriff Committee Works with County Sheriff's to evaluate and bring forward the concerns of the Assembly County Sheriff's to better assist them in the performance of their duties. Provides opportunity to provide coordination between Sheriff Offices.

------Militia Assembly Pillar------

- **Militia Assembly** *Chair Ryan*, All ASC/ASN's have a duty to serve/support the Militia and attend meetings when they are posted. September Event to be announced.
 - Operations Committee Develops short and long-term operational goals for the State Assembly Militia *Chair is Danae*
 - Education Committee Develops tests and educational materials
 - Membership Committee Evaluates Candidates and vets them for specific jobs within the Militia.
 - **Provisions Committee** Acts as a Quartermaster for the Militia, evaluates needs and means to meet those needs for equipment and other provisions needed to carry out militia duties.

------International Business Assembly Pillar-----

The International Business Standing Committee conducts the business of the State on four (4) different levels:

- 1. International with respect to the 50 states /Federation of States
- 2. International with respect to the STATE OF TENNESSEE in Concurrent, Superior General Jurisdiction
- 3 International with respect to the neighboring States, Arkansas, Missouri, Kentucky, Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, and Mississippi.
- 4 International with respect to the 95 Counties of Tennessee in General Jurisdiction.
- International Education and Security Committee Reads and assesses international and global news and trends. Keeps up with security issues and concerns. Is briefed on International issues impacting the States of the Union.
- Congressional Committee Vets candidates for Congressional offices in The Continental Congress. Once the Reconstruction is complete, will also vet candidates for the United States Congressional Delegation. Will receive nominations, publish election notices, secure and announce the elections results, etc.
- **Business Standing Committee** Conducts daily operations and watches over the daily functions of Tennessee State. (accomplish infrastructure projects)

New members may attend these meetings upon invitation, just not nominate/vote in committee matters. This Assembly is the only recognized Tennessee Assembly with provenance. We are a committee-based organization. It is always open to allow qualified participants to join committees - we require that you have your paperwork done and complete the NMO classes and Knowledge Review first and be willing to covenant with us by signing and sealing your common courtesy Participation Agreement.
